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If yes, the IEP team must conduct and/or review a functional behavior assessment and behavior intervention plan for the student. In addition, the team must return the student to his/her prior placement unless the IEP concludes that a change of placement is warranted.

If no, the school may use the regular disciplinary procedures applicable to students without disabilities in the same manner as would be applied to students without disabilities, except that the student must continue to receive educational services during any suspension or expulsion that may be ordered. These services need to target the behavior to limit its reoccurrence and must also enable the student to participate in the general curriculum as well as to progress toward his/her IEP goals.

Note: Regardless of the manifestation determination, school officials may remove a student with a disability(ies) for 45 school days if the child 1) carries or possesses a weapon to or at school, on school premises, or to or at a school function; 2) knowingly possesses or uses illegal drugs, or sells or solicits the sale of a controlled substance, while at school, on school premises, or at a school function.

Definitions:

Student:

Weapon - a weapon, device instrument, material or substance, animate or inanimate, that is used for, or is readily capable of, causing death or serious bodily injury, except that such terms do not include a pocket knife with a blade of less than 2.5 inches in length.

Serious Bodily Injury - 1) A substantial risk of death; 2) extreme physical pain; 3) protracted and obvious disfigurement; or 4) protracted loss or impairment of the function of a bodily member, organ or mental facility.
